As Tennessee prepares to celebrate the second annual Sergeant York Day at his homeplace on October 17, 2009 in Pall Mall, Tennessee to honor the legacy of Sgt. Alvin C. York and the 91st Anniversary of the victorious WWI battle in the Argonne forest, France, the foundation is hosting a drawing contest for all Fentress County students. The drawing should depict the legacy of Sergeant York. Contest Rules:

- 1) The drawing contest is open to all Fentress & Pickett County students (K-12 including home school students).
- 2) The drawing must depict the legacy of Sgt. Alvin C. York (education, school, Christian, portrait, medals, 1917 Enfield rifle, York Agricultural Institute, homeplace, sharp shooter, decorated war hero, battle, etc.)
- 3) Drawings must be black ink or pencil line art on white 8.5x11 paper (original artwork only).
- 4) Drawings to be submitted to the main office at school or mail to SYPF, PO Box 100, Pall Mall, Tennessee 38577; Attention: Drawing Contest
- 5) The deadline to submit the drawing is September 30, 2009.
- 6) All entries must include your name, parents name, address, phone number, email, school, and grade on the back.
- 7) Participants authorize the drawing and artist name to be printed, published and displayed by the SYPF.

Prizes for Drawing Contest: Prizes will be awarded for 1st-3rd places in the following age categories: K-2nd, 3rd-5th, 6th-9th, 10th-12th.

- All entries will be displayed at the homeplace in Pall Mall on October 17, 2009 and prizes awarded.
